Reborn In Detroit

Shirley Maddalena touched many people during the 30 years she made her home in Bloomfield Hills. She successfully raised two boys and met parents involved with the Bloomfield Hills schools, and launched her business, Maddalena Interior Designs. As an award-winning interior designer, she renovated, redesigned and rescued many locations, not only in our neighborhood, but in huge homes in Florida, business offices in New York, and second homes in Northern Michigan.

You may also have met her working with non-profit organizations such as Preservation Bloomfield where she is a founding member and co-chaired with Patty Jessup early on. "It's a wonderful contribution to the city to have that magnificent farmhouse part of Bowers farm. I continue to support that effort," says Shirley.

She originated a popular Holiday High Tea benefit at the Townsend. Years ago, Shirley gathered six friends for a Christmas event to raise money for young women's charities. The method was to bring old jewelry, sell it to someone in the group, and donate the take - a type of White Elephant jewelry auction. As the idea expanded, Shirley organized the first Tea at the Townsend to benefit a relatively new organization known as Alternatives for Girls. Last year, 160 mothers, daughters, and grandmothers came together in the spirit of giving to the kick-off event of the holiday season. Last year the event raised \$18,000 from guests who bring White Elephant treasures for the silent auction, which still includes jewelry. Shirley says, "We get pearls, furs, Burberry scarves, home-made cakes on beautiful serving dishes, and once, two Baccarat champagne flutes. For the flutes, I outbid my friend so I could surprise her for her birthday, which happened to be the same day." Shirley makes her personal contribution to the girls by ordering a catered dinner on New Year's Eve dinner for everyone at the home, including the staff. "Having a delicious dinner for the new year without needadds Shirley.

ing to cook and clean afterward is a wonderful way for them to celebrate,"

Weekends for Shirley often involve visiting her charming home on Mission Peninsula, which faces picturesque Traverse Bay. Shirley says, "It's refreshing to get away to that area. My son and grandson, JB, also live in Traverse City, which is a special incentive." Shirley has designed two separate living areas in that home, so one can be let for Traverse events, skiing, color tours and such.

When Shirley moved to Detroit, many of us were astounded. She has been a member of the Detroit Athletic Club for some years, often exercising there as well as being a member of the Art Committee while living in Bloomfield. "The Art Committee has oversite of the building, now more than 100 years old, and the art collection," Shirley said.

But Shirley's real love affair with the city began as a girl of 14 when she simply got on Greyhound bus in Jackson to go shopping at Hudson's. She worked internships in Detroit at the Bank of Commonwealth for her college major in finance. "I worked summers on Michigan Avenue early in my life, and now I'm back living on the same street." She continues, "l love to walk and observe the rich architecture in the city; I can walk to Red Wings and Tigers games, opera, football, and so many unique eateries and boutique shops."

Shirley is pleased and grateful to have spent 30 years in Bloomfield Hills. "This is where my boys grew up, where I started my interior design business, and where I've met amazing people; I formed some of the best memories of my life. It was just time for a change to spike my creativity and enter a new phase in my journey. I will miss the closeness to everyone, but I'm not far — visit me any time," Shirley concludes. I think we miss her more.

No one in her world of friends and professionals will be surprised to learn that Shirley Maddalena has invented a new design style for her condo: "Detroit Reborn." She describes it as "bringing in a flavor from the 1920s with vintage pieces mixed among contemporary. One hundred years ago, this was a city of artisans, and they are still influencing design today, particularly in detail, sophistication, and variety - that inspires innovation. The Oriental rugs and furniture in my place could easily have been in apartments or homes in the city of Detroit in the 1920s."

Shirley Maddalena lives in a three-bedroom, two-bathroom condo on Griswold and Michigan in the Capitol Park area of Detroit. The Griswold is a new construction built on the Griswold parking

garage. Opened in 2017 with all the modern amenities, such as floor to ceiling windows encasing the condos and concrete floors, it's the best of the old and new world. The interior design of her condo is a perfect example of Detroit Reborn design style.

Kitchen island with Swarovski chandelier in contemporary space

A credenza from the early 1900s is French Deco made from walnut with a bowed front sits beneath

a large, present-day painting of the mid-century icon Marilyn Monroe. It was painted for Shirley by Ben Sharkey, friend, local singer, songwriter, and artist. "I'm a big fan of Marilyn and also have a black and white of her in another place when she was still Norma Jean." An Oriental rug from her collection unifies the space.

An original production Shinola turntable also graces that corner. It was one of the first 500 made by Shinola after a hunt that took the company to a Dallas warehouse per Shirley's request for a rare, light-colored finish. It's another iconic item that evokes a time gone by while adding the elegance and exquisite sound technology of today. Stacks of LPs line the floor, many presented by guests as housewarming gifts. She has favorite vinyls from many eras and especially enjoys classical, jazz, rock and roll, and Latin. One stand-out piece is Van Morrison's "These are the Days."

The view of the polished concrete floor crowned with a crystal chandelier looking toward the kitchen typifies Detroit Reborn. Shirley added the colorful lacquer island to define the galley kitchen and add counter space and storage. The mahogany wood dining table was purchased from the Baker Furniture Company for the riverfront condo her late husband purchased for them in the early 90s. The table extends to seat 10 people.

A favorite item that made the trip from Bloomfield to Detroit is the French 1929 medicine cabinet. Purchased from Judy Frankel Antiques 20 years ago to house glassware, the steel piece developed a patina over the years. A Tattenger's champagne cooler atop the cabinet balances the space to perfection.

Another painting by Ben Sharkey continues the style to the master bedroom. "At the Candy Bar" is a concept developed at the bar in Detroit by the same name. Shirley particularly enjoys the woman using the compact mirror to observe the people behind her.

Shirley's corner office also has floor to ceiling windows; it projects a fresh, clean, contemporary look. She says, "It's conducive to productivity and works with our design software, CAD presentations, information transfer to contractors and artisans for custom furni-

ture or built-ins and such, instead of a physical hand-off. We could not operate our company office and host clients in our studio-home of 1,500 square feet. Technology made this lifestyle possible." Her associate, Katie Rosinski, occupies the second bedroom for her office, using the closet to store sample textiles, paint chips, wallpaper, and other designer products for client presentation.

Overlooking the Capitol Park area of Detroit, the condo provides a perspective of the David Whitney Building, the Fisher Building, Broderick Tower, The Albert, and the water tower painted by American street artist Shepard Fairey.

Indeed, Shirley is living the Detroit dream.

PAYMENT HISTORY

When it comes to your reliability with credit, your past payment history counts for a whopping 35 percent. If you're late paying bills, installment loans, or mortgage loans, you might want to reconsider your ways. Missing payments, better known as delinquencies, can also lower your score.

CREDIT UTILIZATION

Resist the urge to max out your credit cards. Credit card utilization — the ratio between your credit card balance to the available credit — constitutes 30 percent of your credit score. The smaller that percentage is, the higher your credit score will be. Aim to be at least 30 percent below your credit card limit for a higher credit score. Better yet, keep your balance close to zero.

LENGTH OF CREDIT HISTORY

The length of credit history makes up 15 percent of most credit scores. Not closing old accounts is important in trying to boost your score. The more years of credit history you have, the higher your credit score will be.

MIX OF ACCOUNTS

When it comes to credit accounts, diversity is best. Having a mix of accounts constitutes 10 percent of your credit score. A combination of accounts (which can include credit cards, student loans, automobile loans, and mortgages) is superior to one type of account, such as credit cards. Ideally, lenders like to see timely payments with each account.

NEW CREDIT INQUIRIES

New credit inquiries constitute 10 percent of your credit score. Each inquiry into credit can create a temporary dip in your credit score. However, personal credit inquiries will have no bearing on your credit score.

Picnic season is in full swing, so pack along some great cookies! This is my most sought-after cookie recipe...a definite crowd pleaser!

Ingredients: 3/4 cup butter at room temperature

1/2 cup white sugar
3/4 cup light brown sugar
2 teaspoons pure vanilla
2 large eggs
14 oz. moist coconut
2 cups roasted macadamia nut halves
1/2 teaspoon salt
1/2 teaspoon baking soda

2-1/4 cups flour

Method:

- 1. Preheat your oven to 375°F.
- 2. In a mixer bowl, cream butter and sugars together.
- 3. Mix in vanilla and eggs, scraping the bowl down after each addition.
- 4. Mix in coconut and nuts.
- 5. In a separate bowl, whisk salt, soda, and flour together. Then add to wet mixture, mixing thoroughly.
- 6. Form into small balls and place on an ungreased baking sheet.7. Bake 10 to 12 minutes.

Optional: With the coconut, mix in 2 cups of white chocolate chunks.

Chef Lynn's Secrets:

Bake these cookies until they are just set and very lightly browned. Keeping your coconut moist is key. Be sure to store them in an airtight container.

Make ahead: Cool and freeze in airtight bags for up to 3 months. Defrost at room temperature as needed with beautiful results!

Common Cookie Baking Problems and how to fix them: By Chef Lynn M. Miller, Resident Writer

Baby, it's cold outside! Time to get in the kitchen and bake up some comfort food! Cookies are a good place to start. Everyone likes a quick snack or dessert.

The difference between a good cook and a great cook is experience gained from errors. Great cooks have learned about the interaction of ingredients and know what to do when things don't look right. Don't be afraid to make mistakes. Mistakes are valuable lessons. Here are some cookie secrets to get you started: **CRACKED COOKIES:** Probably baked too quickly. Temperature is too high.

COOKIES SPREAD TOO MUCH: Baking temperature too low. Too much sugar in the mix. Can also be too much liquid in the mix.
ROLLED OUT COOKIES ARE TOUGH: Use as little flour as possible when rolling and don't re-roll leftover dough more than once. For sugar cookies, you can roll the dough out on sprinkled sugar instead of flour, but don't re-roll too much or they will get too crispy.
COOKIES ARE NOT CHEWY ENOUGH: Not enough eggs.
COOKIES ARE NOT CRISPY ENOUGH: If you add sugar to a recipe, it will make your cookies crispier.

COOKIES GET TOO BROWN: Baked goods will continue to brown slightly after you take them out of the oven, so take them out just before they are as brown as you would like them. Cookies have carryover cooking too! Let them sit on the hot cookie sheet for a few minutes before removing them to the counter or wire racks to cool. This will allow the cookies to "set" and better retain their shape.
